The course was successfully completed and the valedictory function was organized with the Vice – Chancellor of Acharya N.G. Ranga Agricultural University, Dr. I.V. Subba Rao as President and Dr. S.L.Mehta, D.D.G (Edn.), I.C.A.R., New Delhi as the Chief Guest. Certificates and course manuals were presented to the participants.

A short course on "Resent Advances in Nutrition for Vulnerable Groups" will be conducted during the month of May, 1999.

Objective II:

To update the curriculum and courses of Foods & Nutrition to strengthen teaching and evaluation at UG and PG level.

Four year degree programme at UG level has been formulated and finalized for implementation during the academic year 1999 - 2000.

Two specific areas of nutrition i.e., Nutrition and Dietetics and Community Nutrition which were approved in the Academic Council of the University during 1996 have been implemented for M.Sc. (Foods & Nutrition) programme from the academic year 1997 – 98 onwards.

ALLOCATION OF SEATS UNDER P.G.PROGRAMME

M.Sc.

Over and above the sanctioned strength of 14 M.Sc students four more candidates who have been nominated by ICAR are admitted under Centre of Advanced Studies (one from Assam, one from Kanpur, however, two have discontinued due to personal reasons).

Ph.D.

Ms.Mary Walingo an insevice candidate from Kenya who had been nominated by ICAR and admitted in Ph.D. during the year 1995 – 96, has completed her research on "Impact on dairy programme on nutritional status of vulnerable groups in Kenya", at Kenya. She also submitted her thesis during year 1997. She is the first international candidate to be admitted into the Ph.D. programme of the department and also permitted to work at Kenya.

DEVELOPMENT OF TEXT BOOKS

Two university level text books entitled "Food storage and preservation" and Food Science and Technology" which were submitted by Dr, Vijaya Khader, Director, Centre of Advanced Studies to the University Grants Commission and Indian Council of Agricultural Research, have been accepted for publication and is now in print.

Two chapters on "Food facts and fallacies" and "Nutrition in Emergency" have been contributed by Dr. Vijaya Khader for the text book on "Community Nutrition" being published by the ICAR.

Objective III:

To support the government in training personnel.

World bank aided operational research project in ICDS Centre of Srikakulam district which had been initiated by the department of Foods & Nutrition in the year 1996, has been completed. The main aim of the project was to test the effect of therapeutic food supplementation on the growth and morbidity status of pre-school children of ICDS project run by the department of Women Development & Child Welfare, Govt. OF A.P.

Dr.(Mrs). Sarojini, Scientist I, All India Coordinated Research Project in Foods & Nutrition has been appointed as the Project Co-ordinator, AICRP – Home Science unit at post Graduate & Research Centre, Rajendranagar, Hyderabad.

Dr. (Mrs). S. Sumathi, Associate Professor, has been appointed as co-ordinator for the ICDS sponsored Middle level training centre located at the College of Home Science, A.N.G.R.A.U.

An exhibition is being conducted for farmer's training called "Rythu Utsavam" by ANGRAU and State Agricultural Department from 18th to 22nd March, 1999. The staff of the department are participating in two stalls on post harvest technology and consumer education.

T.V. programmes on "Mushroom cultivation and spawn preparation" by the Director, CAS was telecasted in "Annadata" a distant education program of Doordarshan, Hyderabad, on 3rd November, 1998, 10th November, 1998 and 12th January, 1999.

RADIO TALKS

One radio talk on "Annadataga Mahila" was also broadcasted on 16th October, 1998 (World Food Day), as a special event. Radio talks on various aspects of Nutrition including deficiency diseases and their cure, Nutrient composition of food stuffs, reducing processing losses, etc were delivered by the staff.

SCIENTIFIC PAPERS

Fifteen papers have published by the staff of Department of Foods & Nutrition on various aspects such as Nutritional significance of Red Palm Oil, geriatric foods, product development, Nutritional anthropometry, diet and morbidity of tribal school children in Kurnool district of A.P., Development and storage stability of cereal based papaya products etc., which were pulished in various national and international journals such as, Indian Journal of Social work, Journal of Food Science and Technology, Plant foods for human nutrition, Asia Pacific Journal of Clinical Nutrition etc.

She has also been elected to the Executive Committee of the Nutrition Society of India for a period of two years, i.e., 1999 - 2001.

World Food Day Celebrations

The Department of Foods & Nutrition, College of Home Science, Hyderabad has celebrated World Food Day on 16th October, 1998 at College of Home Science. An essay writing competition was conducted to the Home Science faculty students with the theme "Women feed the world" in English and Telugu. The programme started with prayer followed by welcome by Dr. (Mrs.) Vijaya Khader, Professor & Univ. Head and Director of Centre of Advanced Studies. She stressed the significance of celebrating world food day and highlighting the role of women in food production, food security and nutrition security of the family as well as nation.

- 3. Programme planning and evaluation.

B. ALLOCATION OF SEATS UNDER PG PROGRAMME

Provision of seats in M.Sc and Ph.D in Foods & Nutrition to outside State candidates selected by ICAR through a common test would be decided (as a policy matter) under AHRD subject to the approval of State Government.

Objective 2

To update the curriculum and courses of Foods & Nutrition and strengthen teaching and evaluation at UG and PG level.

Action plan

- To implement the course curriculum for UG programme keeping in view the recommendation of Dean's Committee. (Workshop organized on 7th-12th June, 1993 at APAU, Hyderabad). IV year degree programme will be implemented.
- To organize one workshop for developing PG curriculum during III year of the programme.
- Preparation of one CD-ROM lesson and two video lessons.
- Practical Manuals preparation Intermediary metabolism, Maternal and standards and quality control

- Assessing and developing the training needs of the line departments (Women's Development & Child Welfare; Panchayat Raj & Rural Development) through meetings and group discussions.
